# Hall of Fame... Here and There

### 1973 Centenary Celebrations

The notion of a Trinity 'Hall of Fame' was first brought up in the early 1970s. Club historian at the time, John Lindley, named 43 players in his 'Dreadnoughts' book celebrating Trinity's centenary in 1973.

He based it on 'players who received the highest recognition our code can offer ... Test and Tour selection against Australia, those who gained personal awards in the highest class of club football (RL Challenge Cup, RL Championship, Lance Todd and Harry Sunderland awards) and those who created individual records during their careers at Belle Vue'

The first one named was C.E. 'Teddy' Bartram, a member of the great cup sides of the 1880s, and the last one was David Topliss, the most recent GB debutant in 1973

### 2014

This year, the club decided that a distinguished panel including renowned rugby league author Mike Rylance and ex-MP and fan, David Hinchliffe would select six players for the initial launch (Parkin, Wilkinson, Fox, Turner, Poynton & Topliss were selected) with a fan's vote selecting a further two (Brooke & Exley).

The requirements were international caps, cup winners or league champions ....

which leads us onto tonight.

#### 1991 The Golden Greats

In 1991 a fans voting competition was devised to find Trinity's greatest post-war XIII, with the only minimal requirement being that they played a full season for the club between 1945 and 1990.

The full side chosen was:

**David Topliss** 

- 1894: Born in Sharlston
- 1913: Signed from North Featherstone for £5
- 1915-18: Played at Dewsbury (war years)
- 1919: Yorkshire debut (v Lancashire at Broughton)
- 1920 Selected for GB tour to Australia
- New Zealand
   1920: GB debut v
   Australia at Brisbane
- 1920: Scored a hattrick of tries in 1<sup>st</sup>
   Test v NZ in Auckland
- 1921: England debut (v Wales at Leeds)
- 1921: captain of GB for first time, v Australia, 2<sup>nd</sup> Test at Hull
- 1921: scores 5 tries in a single game for Yorkshire
- 1924: Selected as captain of GB tour to Australia & N7
- 1924: won Yorkshire Cup, beating Batley, 9-8
- 1928: Selected as captain of GB tour
- to Australia & NZ

   1928: 12<sup>th</sup> & final
  England
  appearance
- 1928: 17<sup>th</sup> & last Yorkshire appearance
- 1930: 17<sup>th</sup> & final GB appearance (he missed a further 8 GB test matches due to injury)
- 1930: Bought his own transfer for £100 and signed for Hull KR
- 1988: Elected to the RFL's 'Hall of Fame'

- 1911: Born in Belle Vue, Wakefield
- 1929: Debuted at 17yrs old; the 2<sup>nd</sup> youngest player in Trinity's history at the time
- 1932: England debut v Wales at Llanelli
- 1932: Yorkshire debut (v. Lancs, at Wakefield)
- 1935: Travelled to France as part of a RL representative XIII team and played all three games (repeated in 1938)
- 1936: Selected for GB tour to Australia
- New Zealand
   1936: Played 13 games for GB on tour, but no tests
- 1938: last of his 10 Yorks appearances
- 1939: 3<sup>rd</sup> & last England cap
- 1946: Won a RL Challenge Cup winners medal at Wembley, v Wigan (13-12)
- 1946: Won a Yorkshire League Championship winners medal
- 1946: Won a Yorkshire Cup winners medal (v. Hull, 10-0)
- 1947: Played his last Trinity game in the 0-21 defeat to Leeds in the RL Challenge Cup semi final
- This was his 449<sup>th</sup> appearance, the 2<sup>nd</sup> best in Trinity's history at the time and 4<sup>th</sup> all time best at this present time

- 1930: Debuted as a young back rower before moving into the front row
- Played in six
   Yorkshire Cup
   Finals, losing the
   first five in 1932,
   1934, 1936, 1940 &
   1945
- 1936: Yorkshire debut v Cumberland at Workington
- 1942: Broke the record for consecutive appearances in a Trinity shirt (96 between 1939 & 1942). Still a record today
- 1943: England debut
- v Wales at Wigan
   1946: 4<sup>th</sup> & last
  England cap,
  v France at Swinton
- 1946: Won a RL Challenge Cup winners medal at Wembley, v Wigan (13-12)
- 1946: Won the Yorkshire League Championship
- 1946: Won the Yorkshire Cup, as captain
- 1946: Won his 8<sup>th</sup> and last Yorkshire cap v Lancashire at Hunslet
- 1949: Played his 618<sup>th</sup> & last Trinity match in April (v. Huddersfield)
- His 618 first team appearances are still a Trinity record today and will

- Won 2 RL Challenge Cup winners medals (1962 & 1963)
- 1963: Won Lance Todd Trophy at Wembley as man of the match
- 1962: Selected for GB tour to Australia & New Zealand
- 1962: GB debut in 2<sup>nd</sup> Test v Australia at Lang Park, Brisbane
- 1962: Made 3 GB test appearances 'Down Under', aswell as 9 other GB tour matches
- 1967: Captained Trinity to RL Championship Trophy success (21-9 v St.Helens, after 7-7 draw)
- 1968: Captained Trinity to RL Championship Trophy success (17-10 v Hull KR)
- 1968: Granted a club benefit by Trinity
- 1969: Retired after 319 appearances (16<sup>th</sup> on all-time list)
- Total of 11 winners medals for Trinity

- 1932: Born in Ossett
- 1959: Signed for Trinity from Oldham, after time at Hull KR
- 1959: Elected as club captain in his first season
- 1959: first Yorkshire appearance as a Trinity player (4 previous caps)
- 1959: first GB test as a Trinity player, v Australia at Swinton (11 previous GB caps)
- 1960: Represented GB in the World Cup, becoming only the third Trinity player to win the World Cup
- Captained Trinity to 3 RL Challenge Cup wins (1960, 1962 & 1963)
   1962: Selected for
- GB tour to Australia & New Zealand (vice captain) • 1962: Captained GB
- in 2 tests v NZ, playing in all five tests 'Down Under' • Total of 8 winners
- Total of 8 winners medals for Trinity, all as captain (3x Challenge Cups, 2x Yorkshire Cups, 3x Yorkshire League Championships)
- He would finish with 24 GB caps (13 at Trinity)
- Plus, 10 Yorkshire appearances (6 at Trinity)

- 1983-84: Trinity coach for 7 months (31 games), a team featuring Wally Lewis
- Nicknamed 'Rocky'

- 1943: Born in Plymouth, moving to Wakefield as a youngster
- Yorkshire Schools & Yorkshire u19s rep
- 1961: Represented England u19s, v France; signing for Trinity in same year
- 1963: Scored a try at Wembley as Trinity beat Wigan, 25-10 to win the RL Cup three times in four years (Trinity's youngest ever RL Cup final scorer)
- 1964: Transferred to Bradford but after Yorkshire caps & 1966 GB Tour 'Down Under', returned to Trinity in 1967
- 1967: Won an RL Championship winners medal, scoring 2 tries in replayed final (v. St. Helens)
- 1967: Won the Ashes with GB after 3 tests against the Australians
- 1968: Won a 2<sup>nd</sup> R Championship winners medal (v. Hull KR)
- 1968: Played in the RL Challenge Cup 'Watersplash' Final
- 1968: Travelled to Australia with the GB World Cup team, playing in all three games
- Finished with 13 GB test appearances, 8 whilst with Trinity
- 1978-79: Coached Trinity for a year (30 games), aswell as being part of the 1990s coaching team

- 1949: Born in Normanton 1968: Signed for
- Trinity from Normanton Juniors 1971: Yorkshire
- debut v Cumberland at Castleford 1972: Selected for
- GB World Cup squad in France, but not playing any games
- 1973: GB debut v Australia at Wembley (21-12 win)
- 1973-74: Played in Trinity's Yorkshire Cup Final defeats 1978: 14<sup>th</sup> and final Yorkshire county appearance
- 1979: Captained Trinity to Wembley
- 1979: Won Lance Todd Trophy at Wembley as man of the match
- 1979: Selected for GB tour to Australia & New Zealand (playing in 3<sup>rd</sup> Test v Australia at SCG)
- 1981: Left for Hull
- 1987: Returned as player-coach (from Oldham)
- 1988: Retired as a player with 417 appearances (8<sup>th</sup> on the all-time list)
- He also scored 195 tries; 2<sup>nd</sup> on the alltime Trinity list
- 1992: Coached Trinity to Yorkshire Cup success, Trinity's first major honour in 14 years
- Coached Trinity in 241 games in seven years (1987-94), second only to Ken Traill in Trinity's coaching history
